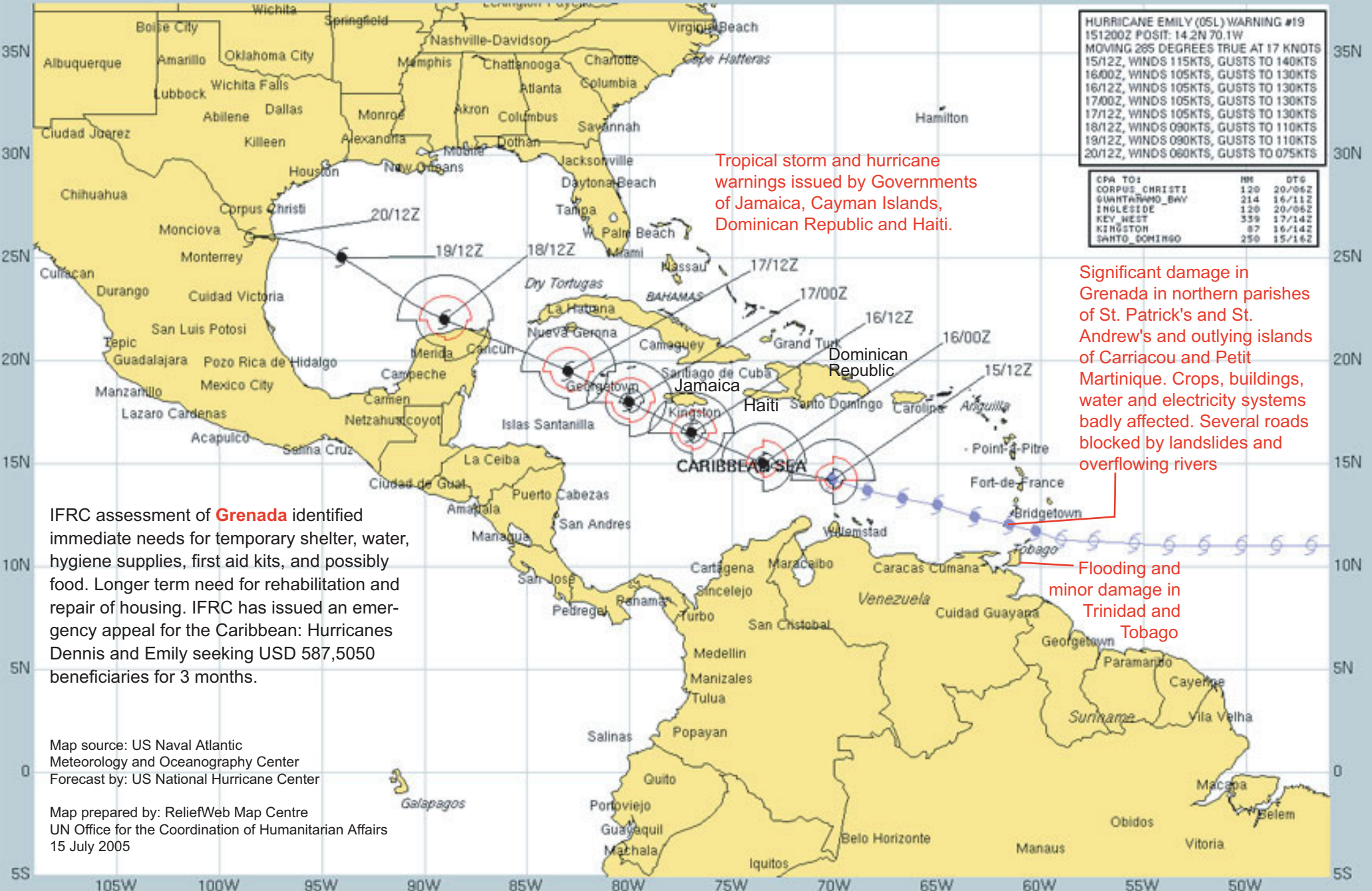




Caribbean: Hurricane Emily (as of 15 July 2005 1815Z)

Tropical storm and hurricane warnings issued by Governments of Jamaica, Cayman Islands, Dominican Republic and Haiti.

Significant damage in Grenada in northern parishes of St. Patrick's and St. Andrew's and outlying islands of Carriacou and Petit Martinique. Crops, buildings, water and electricity systems badly affected. Several roads blocked by landslides and overflowing rivers

Flooding and minor damage in Trinidad and Tobago

IFRC assessment of **Grenada** identified immediate needs for temporary shelter, water, hygiene supplies, first aid kits, and possibly food. Longer term need for rehabilitation and repair of housing. IFRC has issued an emergency appeal for the Caribbean: Hurricanes Dennis and Emily seeking USD 587,5050 beneficiaries for 3 months.
